SUBJECT Critical Success Factors: Institutional Data

Each year the North Carolina Community College System is required to report data on Critical Success Factors and Measures to the State Board of Community Colleges and to the General Assembly. Both system-level and college-level data are presented in the report. The data are used to determine the progress of the system and colleges in attaining system-level goals and to decide, where appropriate, the performance of colleges relative to performance standards established by the system.

In order to ensure that the data reported are accurate, a copy of the institutional data tables has been attached for your review and verification. At this point, we are still missing data on some measures; however, to allow colleges enough time to verify the data, we are sending to you those measures for which we do have data. As the remaining data become available, they will be sent to you for review.

Please review the attached data tables and send any corrections, along with documentation to support the corrections, to Dr. Xiaoyun Yang at the System Office, by February 28. In reviewing the data, you must use the same definitions that are used by the System Office in the collection and analysis of the data. If you have any questions regarding the data, please contact Dr. Yang or me.

A thorough description of each measure can be found in the 1997 Critical Success Factors Report. The following brief description, however, will help you in interpreting the data.

1. The data are for the 1996-97 fiscal year (July 1, 1996 - June 30, 1997) with the one exception: the data on nursing exam results are for the calendar year 1996.
2. To the best of our knowledge, the data on licensure and certification exams are for first time test takers only . . . please use this criterion when examining the data.
3. When corroborating the percentages for the progress of basic skills students, using Table 3 of the Annual Literacy Data Report, subtract the number of students who moved to a

higher level from the number of students who completed a level or goal and then calculate the percentages for the four fields used (Number G/L Completed, Number Progressing, Number Separated, and Number Moved).

Thank you for your cooperation in verifying the data.
