SUBJECT: Request for Participants for Late Nite Labs Workshops

There have been many innovations in distance learning over the past several years. However, one of the most challenging needs has been in the area of science. To address these needs the North Carolina Community College System is expanding its distance learning science courses through the integration of software from Late Nite Labs. This software can be used to supplement on campus chemistry courses or allow students to complete chemistry laboratory course work through distance education. Students will be able to learn traditional laboratory concepts through experiments performed in a new and exciting delivery environment.

In order to introduce and demonstrate this new software to faculty in our colleges, four one-day regional training workshops have been scheduled. The locations and dates are:
