SUBJECT: NUR 3004 - Nurse Aide Level II – Transition

The North Carolina State Board of Community Colleges approved a new continuing education course. NUR 3004, *EMT-I/Paramedic Bridge to Nurse Aide Level II*, at its January State Board Meeting. The new course is a “pared down version” of NUR 3241, *Nurse Aide Level II* and will provide a mechanism for Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate and Paramedics to receive training and competency testing necessary to be certified as a Nurse Aide Level II.

The addition of the course to the Master Course List will meet an apparent need for a health care provider that can be flexible, adaptable, multi-skilled, and capable of functioning in a variety of health care settings – depending on staffing needs. The course will also decrease content repetition for selected allied health individuals wishing to be certified as a Nurse Aide Level II.

## **NUR 3004, EMT-I/PARAMEDIC BRIDGE TO NURSE AIDE LEVEL II**

**Course Code:** NUR 3004

**Course Title:** EMT-I/Paramedic Bridge to Nurse Aide Level II

**Total Hours:** 127 hours (47 hours classroom, 80 hours clinical)

### **Course Description:**

This Nursing Assistant course prepares graduated to perform more complex skills for patients or residents regardless of the setting. A skill/competency evaluation is required for documenting student competency. The course includes classroom, laboratory and clinical learning experiences. Upon satisfactory completion of the course and skill/competency evaluation, the graduate is eligible to apply for listing as a Nurse Aide II by the North Carolina Board of Nurse Aide Registry. This course is limited to individuals currently certified by the state of North Carolina as Emergency Medical Technicians-Intermediate or Paramedics.
