Emphasis is placed on selection and maintenance of the bicycle, gear shifting, pedaling techniques, safety procedures, and conditioning exercises necessary for cycling. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate safe handling of a bicycle for recreational use. *This course has been approved to satisfy the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement for transferability as a premajor and/or elective course requirement.*

Proposed Prefix/Title: PED 215 Outdoor Cycling

Proposed Description: This course is designed to promote physical fitness through outdoor cycling. Emphasis is placed on selection and maintenance of the bicycle, gear shifting, pedaling techniques, safety procedures, and conditioning exercises necessary for outdoor cycling. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate safe handling of a bicycle for recreational use. *This course has been approved to satisfy the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement for transferability as a premajor and/or elective course requirement.*

Rationale of College Requesting Revision: A request has been submitted for a new course titled "PED 216 Indoor Cycling". This new course, if approved by the Curriculum Review Committee, will enable colleges that have access to fitness centers to utilize stationary bikes for indoor cycling or "Spinning". The acceptance of the new course would require revision to PED 180 in order to differentiate between the two types of cycling.
