4 23 NCAC 02C .0110 INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

- 5 (a) No college shall operate an intercollegiate athletic program or team unless the college maintains a
6 membership in good standing with the National Junior College Athletic Association and Region
7 10. All club teams must be designated as such through the NJCAA and abide by all eligibility
8 guidelines.
- 9 (b) A college shall not participate in intercollegiate athletics unless any foundation associated with the
10 college pursuant to G.S. 115D-20(9) adopts a policy requiring that the total amount of all athletic
11 scholarships awarded to an individual student-athlete does not exceed the participating student's
12 expenses for tuition, college fees, and course-related books and materials required for the courses
13 in which that student is enrolled.
- 14 (c) A college shall not participate in intercollegiate athletics unless the total amount of all athletic
15 scholarships the college awards plus the total amount of all athletic scholarships awarded by any
16 foundation associated with the college pursuant to G.S. 115D-20(9) does not exceed the
17 participating student's expenses for tuition, college fees, and course-related books and materials
18 required for the courses in which that student is enrolled.
- 19 (d) State funds shall not be used to create, support, maintain, or operate an intercollegiate athletics
20 program.
- 21 (e) Colleges shall neither provide nor offer room and board, as part of an intercollegiate athletic
22 scholarship, to any student participating in an intercollegiate athletics sport, except for temporary
23 room and board associated with specific athletic events.
- 24 (f) For the purposes of this rule, tuition waivers granted by statute for students participating in any
25 intercollegiate athletics sport shall be deemed to be a scholarship for tuition.
