I. Program Planning

Vance-Granville Community College (VGCC) is seeking approval for the Global Logistics Technology (C25170) program at the certificate level to begin Spring 2010 at all sites of the Federal Correctional Complex in Butner, NC, as listed above.

Based on U.S. Bureau of Labor statistics for May 2008, entry-level employment may be found as transportation agent, shipping and receiving clerk, warehouse lead, or order/procurement clerk, with an annual salary ranging from \$20,160 to \$35,680. Supervisor-level salaries can range up to \$44,300.

II. Impact of the Proposed Program on Other Programs

The Federal Correctional Complex in Butner spans the service areas of two colleges: VGCC and Durham Technical Community College (DTCC). The president of DTCC has been contacted about this program application and indicates no objection.

III. Feasibility Plan

The Federal Bureau of Prisons has allocated instructional space that is appropriate for the program, and local prison officials are committed to providing inmate students who meet the educational admissions requirements.

Projected enrollment, based on program capacity:

1st class:	15 full-time	0 part-time
2nd class:	15 full-time	0 part-time

VGCC proposes to start one program, with students participating from all five sites in the federal complex. Start-up costs will be \$60,434, including instructor costs and instructional supplies, and the Federal Bureau of Prisons will fund \$39,000 of this cost. Projected ongoing costs are \$45,432 per year. The funds necessary to operate the program after year two will come from regular budget FTE. No additional allocation of funds will be necessary to support the program.
