**I. Program Planning**

Edgecombe Community College (ECC) is seeking approval for the Historic Preservation Technology (A35110) program, to begin Fall 2010. The planning area is defined as the college's service area of Edgecombe County, in addition to Beaufort, Bertie, Bladen, Brunswick, Camden, Carteret, Chatham, Chowan, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Currituck, Dare, Duplin, Franklin, Gates, Granville, Greene, Harnett, Halifax, Hertford, Hyde, Johnston, Jones, Lee, Lenoir, Martin, Nash, New Hanover, North Hampton, Onslow, Pamlico, Pasquotank, Pender, Perquimans, Pitt, Robeson, Sampson, Tyrell, Vance, Wake, Warren, Washington, Wayne and Wilson counties.

All colleges were notified of the planning process for this program, and a planning meeting was held. The college conducted an employment availability survey within the planning area:

Currently:	9 employment positions available
1st graduating class:	13 employment positions available
2nd graduating class:	23 employment positions available

The average entry-level salary is \$26,000 per year.

**II. Impact of the Proposed Program on Other Programs**

No community colleges are currently approved to offer the Historic Preservation Technology (A35110) program; therefore, ECC was not required to send impact assessment forms to colleges.

**III. Feasibility Plan**

Edgecombe Community College surveyed current ECC students, industry, and students attending high schools in the service area. The results indicated the following:

Full-time:	33	potential students
Part-time:	67	potential students

Projected enrollment for the first two classes:

1st class:	12 full-time	no part-time
2nd class:	12 full-time	12 part-time

The college has adequate space to offer the program which it currently offers as continuing education. The approximate start-up costs include \$25,000 for facilities and equipment and \$58,000 for instructor costs. The ongoing costs include \$10,000 for equipment and \$65,000 for instructor's costs. ECC has received a Golden Leaf grant for the program in the amount of \$55,000. Additional costs will be funded through the college's regular state budget allocation.
