Definition of Basic Skills Programs included under BSP 2000:

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION (ABE): A program of basic educational skills for adults aged 16 or older who: are out of school, have not graduated from high school, or function at less than the ninth grade level of competency.

GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (GED): A program of instruction designed to prepare adult students to pass the General Education Development (GED) test that leads to a High School Diploma Equivalency.

ADULT HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA (AHS): A program of instruction offered cooperatively with local public school systems to help adult students earn an Adult High School Diploma.

COMPENSATORY EDUCATION (CED): A program of instruction providing Basic Education Skills for adults with intellectual disabilities.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL): A program of instruction to help adults who have limited or no proficiency in the English language.
