Creating Success Strategy: Workforce Development – Local Request

Training Program/ Course Request(s):

Course ID	Course Title	Recommended Hours	Program Area
CAR-3200	Construction Management	336	H30-Construction Occupations

Rationale:

- This training program will prepare individuals with backgrounds in construction to advance to supervisory or management positions. Such positions may include project manager, superintendent, estimator, foreman and inspector. Course work includes safety, planning, scheduling, estimating, blueprint reading, supervision, and building codes. An overview of the trades involved in construction will be presented. Upon completion of the course, students will be qualified to manage construction projects.
- Students who complete the program may sit for an industry-recognized credential with the **National Center for Construction Education and Research**.

SUR-3100	Surgical Technology Exam Review	24	L30 – Health Occupations

Rationale:

- This course is designed for individuals preparing for industry-recognized credentials as a surgical technician. Topics include an overview of the theoretical knowledge for application of essential operative skills during the perioperative phase of surgical patient care, medical terminology, and exam preparation/test-taking strategies.

FUR-3300	Furniture Production Worker	336	P35-Industrial Occupations

Rationale:

- Request from Department of Correction to support their Correction Enterprise program.
- This program prepares the student to work in a furniture production plant or cabinet plant as a basic machine operator, finisher, or assembly worker. Course work includes basic furniture machine setup, clamping, sanding, finishing, and assembly fundamentals. Employment opportunities include basic machine operators, sprayers, sanders, and assemblers.
