CFNC Programs and Resources for Students and Administrators (Webinar)

March 26, 2010

10:00 am to 11:30 am and 2:00 pm to 3:30 pm

The sessions will be led by Monique Williamson, CFNC Transfer Articulation System Manager; Katie Prosser McInerney, CFNC Campus Services Manager; and Julia Conrad, Associate Director, GEAR UP North Carolina. This session will provide an overview of CFNC programs and resources for students and administrators. Topics of interest include the following:

- **Student Transfer Navigator** is a useful tool that will assist students in planning their academic program as they move from a North Carolina community college to a four year institution in North Carolina. The tool provides a course equivalence report for students who have taken or plan to take courses at any of North Carolina's postsecondary institutions. Students may compare course equivalence for any two institutions at a time in three easy steps. Course equivalence information is available for courses transferring from all North Carolina community colleges to North Carolina colleges and universities.
- **The College Redirection Pool** primarily assists students who have been denied admission from the institution of their choice and are seeking opportunities to pursue Higher Education in the fall. The goal is for every student in the College Redirection Pool to be contacted by, at least, their local North Carolina community college. The system is available between April 1st and August 31st.
- The **CFNC Electronic Transcript System** allows students to request and send high school transcripts to all 110 of North Carolina's colleges and universities. The system allows multiple ways to request and track transcript requests for students and campuses. More than 213,000 students have used the system to send high school transcripts.
- The **CFNC Choices Planner Career Transitions Tool** is built for college and adult students. This area of CFNC is a perfect place to focus on majors, career planning, career searches, etc. The Bridges Professional Center also allows campus representatives to view and track the status of their student's progress through the Career tools.
- **College Application Week** is a state-wide event in North Carolina sponsored by College Foundation North Carolina (CFNC) and the Carolinas Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (CACRAO). The program provides high school seniors the opportunity to complete and submit online college applications through CFNC.org with help from counselors and volunteers. This event has grown annually with nearly 25,000 students submitting over 50,000 college applications from 421 high schools in every school district in 2009.
