Allied Health Courses

- EKG Technician (60 hours): Topics include cardiac terminology, structure, function, anatomy, and physiology of the heart.
- Dietary Management: (150 hours/2 semesters): Course topics include nutrition in the life cycle, therapeutic nutrition, food system management, and personnel and administration
- Healthcare Billing and Coding (150 hours): Topics include managed health care, life cycle of insurance claim, legal and regulatory considerations, reimbursement issues, claim instructions, and insurance plans
- Medication Aide (24 hours): Topics include medication administration, hand hygiene, and legal implications
- Nurse Aide I (190 hours): Course topics include communication, safety, patient's rights, personal care, vital signs, elimination, nutrition, restorative care and rehabilitation in the long term care setting
- Nurse Aide II (190 hours): course prepares students to perform more complex skills for patients and residents.
- Pharmacy Tech (100 hours): Provides instruction for preparing and dispensing drugs in a hospital or retail setting
- Phlebotomy (220 hours): Course provides theory and clinical experiences needed for proper collection of blood and other specimens used in diagnostic testing
