



## **Presidential Search Announcement**

The North Carolina State Board of Community Colleges invites applications and nominations for the position of President of the North Carolina Community College System.

### **The North Carolina Community College System (System)**

The North Carolina Community College System, one of the largest and most accessible systems of higher education in the country, provides oversight and guidelines for community colleges serving 100 counties and approximately 700,000 students annually. Campuses are located within 30 miles of 99 percent of North Carolinians. The colleges stretch across North Carolina from Tri-County Community College, located in Murphy, to College of The Albemarle, located in Elizabeth City. The System Office is located in downtown Raleigh, the largest city in the Research Triangle with a population of over 450,000. Raleigh is one of the fastest-growing urban centers in the United States of America. Along with Durham and Chapel Hill, Raleigh anchors the Research Triangle, a national center for high-tech enterprise.

The mission of the North Carolina Community College System is to open the door to high-quality, accessible educational opportunities that minimize barriers to post-secondary education, maximize student success, develop a globally and multi-culturally competent workforce, and improve the lives and well-being of individuals by providing:

- (1) Education, training, and retraining for the workforce including basic skills and literacy education, occupational and pre-baccalaureate programs.
- (2) Support for economic development through services to and in partnership with business and industry and in collaboration with the University of North Carolina and private colleges and universities.
- (3) Services to communities and individuals that improve the quality of life.

The State Board of Community Colleges selects the President of the North Carolina Community College System who shall serve as the chief administrative officer of the System. The North Carolina Community College System Office provides policy oversight and guidelines for the 58 community and technical colleges in the system. Each college has its own governing board with powers to elect a president subject to final approval by the State Board of Community Colleges.

### **The Position**

The North Carolina State Board of Community Colleges is seeking an individual who possesses a general understanding of and appreciation for the mission and philosophy of the North Carolina Community College System. The candidate of choice should be a creative, visionary, experienced leader of high energy, exemplary personal integrity, and professional ethics and should possess the ability to work with and respect a constituency of diverse needs and interests.

## **Minimum Qualifications**

- an earned doctorate or master's degree from a regionally-accredited university is preferred;
- at least five years of senior leadership experience in a community college system or college/or in public higher education; or equivalent senior leadership in a private sector business environment.

## **Desired Traits and Skills**

- A passion for the value of public higher education as well as a demonstrated commitment to open-access, affordability, and academic excellence
- A demonstrated success in working with a board formulating policy and guidelines
- A clear understanding of and ability to build strong legislative relationships
- A thorough understanding of effective budget and financial management
- A successful record of promoting partnerships with various constituencies, including other educational agencies, businesses, civic organizations, and community groups
- An understanding of and support for the role of community colleges in economic development and workforce preparation
- A proven ability to build and inspire effective and cohesive teams that advance strategic and legislative priorities
- A proven record of developing and executing strategic plans.
- A commitment to cultural, ethnic and gender diversity of students and staff
- Superior interpersonal skills, approachability, and a proven ability to handle multiple competing demands.
- An open communications style with strong listening, writing and speaking skills
- A collaborative leadership style that can build consensus inside the system and with outside partners
- The ability to adapt to emerging national, state, and local educational issues
- An understanding of current opportunities and challenges facing the North Carolina Community College System and the ability to articulate a clear vision for the future of the System

## **Application Process**

A complete application must include a letter of introduction which describes the candidate's strengths in relation to the qualifications listed above; a resume; and the names, titles, email addresses and telephone numbers of five (5) references. The application period begins with the electronic advertisement and publication of this announcement on the North Carolina Community College System website. The deadline for receipt of applications is January 16, 2018, by 5:00 pm EST.
