

STATE BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES
Proposed Modifications to NCCCS Performance Measures

In November 2011, the State Board formally approved a new set of performance measures for North Carolina community colleges. These measures were then submitted to the General Assembly in March 2012 and later adopted in June 2012 through Section 8.5 of S.L.2012-142.

During the development of these measures, it was determined that it was important to build in a three year review process to ensure the measures and methods for evaluating colleges were current and remained focused on improving student success.

To facilitate the first three year review of the measures, President Scott Ralls appointed an ad hoc committee chaired by Stanly Community College President Brenda Kays to review the current set of measures and recommend deletions, revisions, and additions. - Developmental Student Success Rate in College-Level English Courses - *Remove based on the various stages in which colleges have implemented developmental redesign*
- Developmental Student Success Rate in College-Level Math Courses - *Remove based on the various stages in which colleges have implemented developmental redesign*

- Student Success Rate in Gateway Math Courses

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
