**Allocation of Title II, Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA)**  
**Section 225, Corrections Education and Other Institutionalized Individuals**  
**FY 2022-23**

**Request:** The State Board of Community Colleges is requested to approve the federal Workforce and Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA), Title II Corrections and Other Institutionalized Individuals (C&I) Section 225 funding allocation for 36 Corrections Education and Other Institutionalized Individuals Programs in the amount of \$780,552.

**Strategic Plan Reference:**

**Theme: Economic and Workforce Impact**

Goal 3: To ensure the educational pipeline prepares a workforce possessing the interest, knowledge, skills, and abilities to meet the needs of employers, now and into the future.

- Objective 3.1: Collaborate with the stakeholders to promote a workforce system that fosters innovation and establishes seamless connections among community colleges, K-12 education, universities, workforce and economic development partners, and business and industry.

**Background:** C&I programs require that funds be used to carry out a program for criminal offenders in a correctional institution giving priority to serving individuals who are likely to leave the correctional institution within 5 years of participation in the program.

**Method of Allocation:** Title II WIOA Section 225 funds are distributed by the NC Community College System according to a formula adopted by the SBCC in July 2019. The formula has 3 components:

1. **Base:** 30% of available funding is allocated equally across providers.
2. **Participation:** 30% of available funding is allocated based on the provider's share of participants. That share is multiplied by a dedicated allotment to determine provider allocation. Participant is defined as an individual in a Title II program who has received at least 12 hours of service in a Period of Participation (POP). The participation component is available only to providers who have submitted 2020-2021 data.
3. **Performance:** 40% of available funding is allocated based on the provider's share of Measurable Skills Gains (MSGs). That share is multiplied by a dedicated allotment to determine provider allocation. The performance component is available only to providers who have submitted 2020-2021 data.
