

STATE BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES
Contract for Moodle Hosting Services
FY 2018-19

Request: The State Board is asked to approve a three-year Moodle Hosting Services contract with [REDACTED], for a Moodle® Software as a Service (SaaS) hosting solution. This contract is to provide Moodle learning management system (LMS) software and support services for the North Carolina Community Colleges System (NCCCS) colleges that choose Moodle as their primary LMS. This contract is for the three-year period from [REDACTED] (or for the three-year period commencing on the date of award of the contract, whichever is later) for an amount not to exceed \$ [REDACTED] and includes the ability for NCCCS to amend the contract within the State requirements to remove individual line items to reduce cost over the three-year period.

Strategic Plan Reference:

Theme: Student Interest and Access

Goal 3: Identify and reduce access barriers for all prospective students, particularly among underserved populations.

- Objective 2: Promote more flexible scheduling and instructional delivery formats to reach non-traditional students.

Background: In March 2010, the NCCCS decided to support two learning management systems for the 58 community colleges: Blackboard®, a licensed LMS, and Moodle, an open source LMS. The NCCCS submitted a RFP on 1/20/12 for a fully managed and hosted enterprise solution for a service offering the Moodle LMS for our colleges, and the contract was awarded to Remote-Learner.Net. In 2016, the North Carolina Department of Information Technology requested that NCCCS issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) to provide competitive bidding for this contract. NCCCS issued a RFP on October 16, 2017. Funding for this contract provides a 24x7x365 integrated course management solution, hosted hardware, application administration, administrator help desk support, and training to sustain the centralized Moodle implementation. This contract also provides consistency of services and training across the system, while still allowing branding of the online course delivery for the local college. The services are essentially delivered via the Internet as a SaaS offering the computing power, data storage, and Moodle expertise that the colleges do not have or could not afford without System Office support.

Rationale: Each community college chooses the LMS that best suits the needs of that college and the learning community it serves, and the System Office supports that local choice through funding and support. NCCCS conducted a survey of the colleges to determine which colleges would be interested in the Moodle hosting services. In 2017-18, 28 colleges and the System Office participated in the Moodle Hosting Services contract. For FY 2018-19, the System Office and 35 colleges will take part in the Moodle SaaS hosting contract. Seven colleges which currently use the [REDACTED] solution, [REDACTED], will be transitioning to this System-wide agreement. This will result in a savings of \$ [REDACTED] for those seven colleges. [REDACTED]

Approval of the contract by the State Board is contingent upon approval by the NC Department of Information Technology Contracts and Strategic Sourcing.
