

STATE BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES
Allocation for 2013-2014 Minority Male Mentoring Program Grants

Request: The State Board of Community Colleges is asked to approve an allocation of \$840,500 to forty-one community colleges for the Minority Male Mentoring Program (3MP).

Background: The NC Minority Male Mentoring Program was established in the fall of 2003, using 6 pilot programs to improve retention and graduation rates. Since inception, the program has received \$3,849,580. In FY 2012-13 there were forty-six programs statewide.

Rationale: The intent of these allocations is to provide competitive grants that assist colleges with retention and graduation through academic coaching, personal counseling, and professional growth and development for at-risk minority male students. Each currently active participating college will receive funding based on their level of student participation during the 2012-2013 year. The total program award for FY2013-2014 is \$840,500. Each college selected will receive a base funding allocation of \$20,500.

Grant recipients will be required to expend funds within four areas: faculty and counselor support, general operating cost, student support wages (peer tutors, study ambassadors, etc.), and student development activities. Additional funding will be used for the planning and implementation of professional development.

Method of Allocation: During 2013, a Request-for-Proposals was forwarded to all 58 community colleges. A committee of six, consisting of representatives from the System Office, UNC-GA, NCICU, and a current Minority Male Mentoring Program Coordinator, reviewed and equitably selected colleges to receive funding. The proposals were scored on the following criteria: 1) needs and challenges, 2) program objectives, 3) implementation strategies, 4) anticipated benefits, 5) evaluation, dissemination, and replication, and 6) budget plan.

Fund Source and Availability: \$810,000 is available from the FY2013-2014 State General Fund appropriation and \$30,500 is available from the College Access Challenge Grant funds from the University of North Carolina General Administration.

Time Period: The time frame for the state funded Minority Male Mentoring Program grants is from July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014 and the CACG Minority Male Mentoring Program grant is from July 1, 2013 to April 30, 2014.
