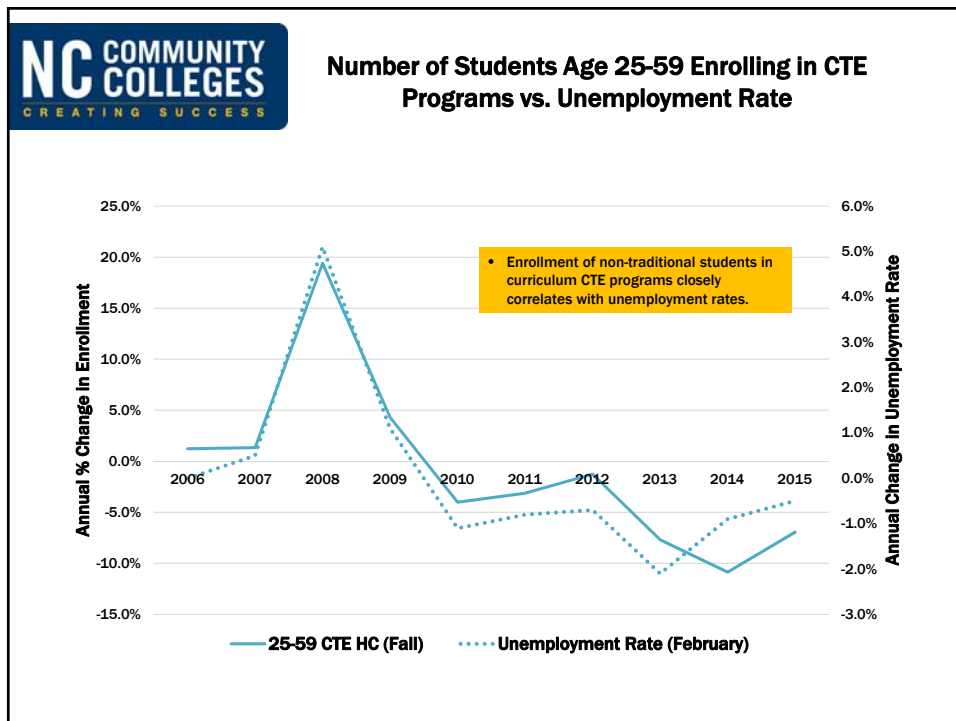
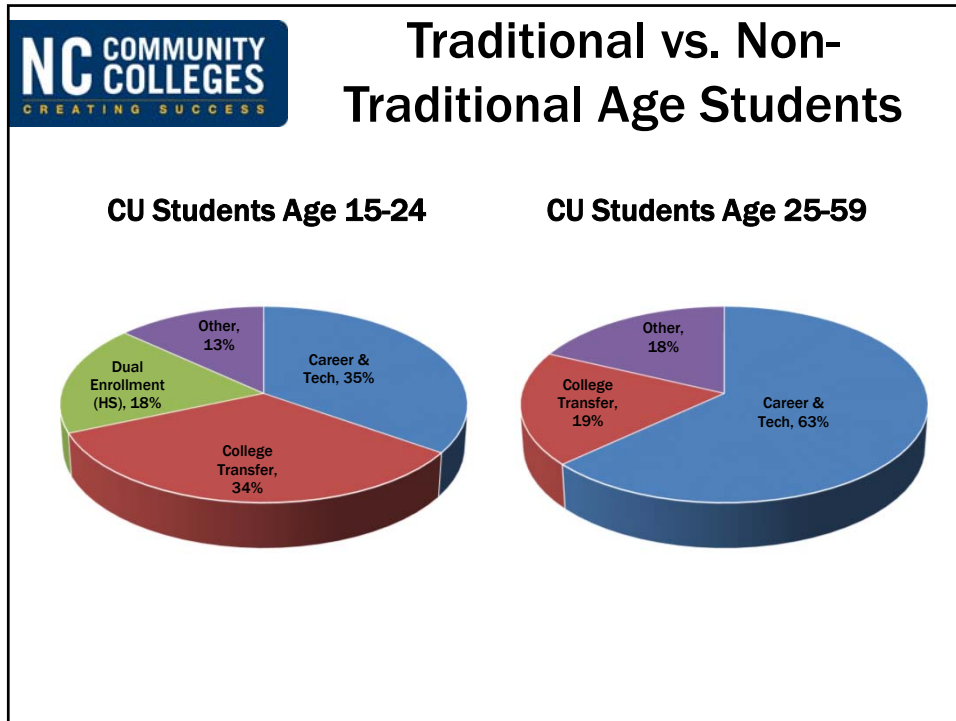


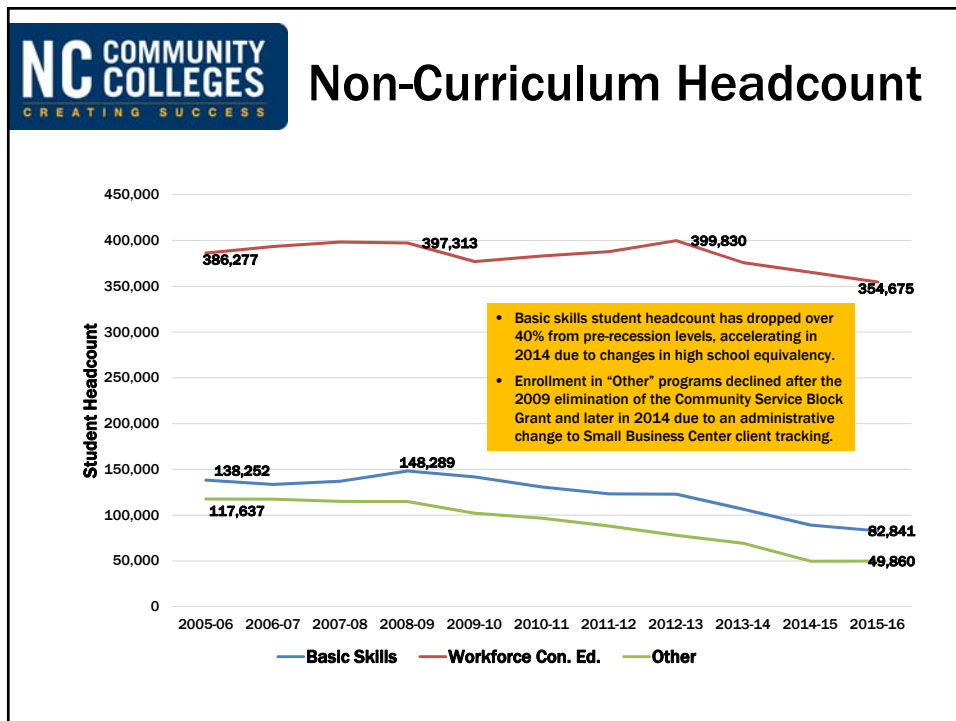
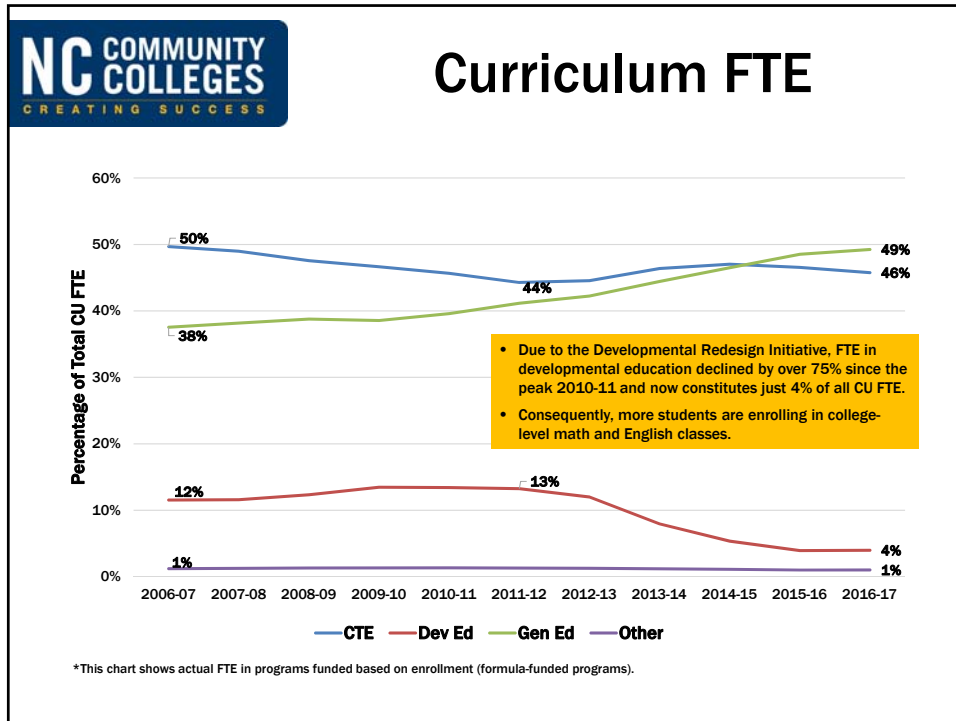
Enrollment Metrics

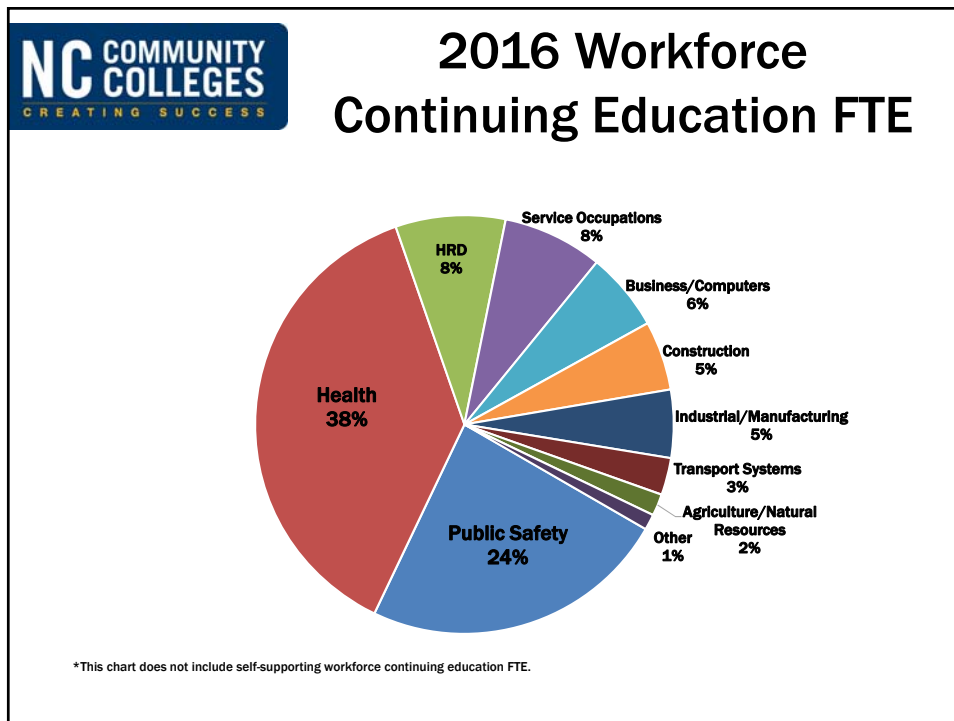
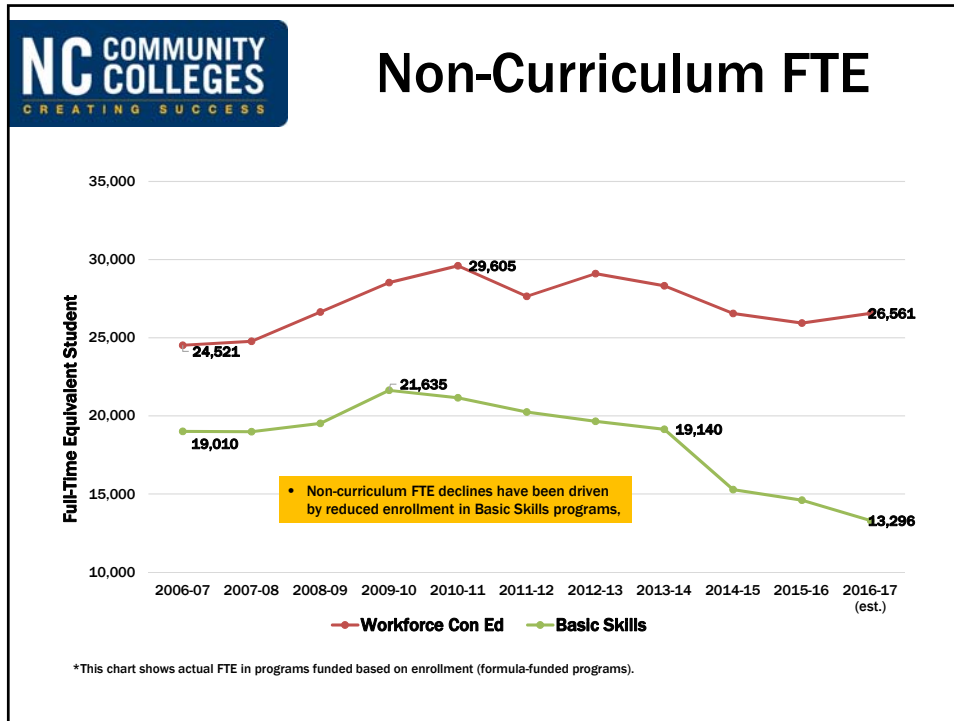
- **Student Headcount:**
 - How many individuals do we serve?
 - Number of students that enroll and take at least one course.
- **Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Students:**
 - How much instruction do we provide?
 - FTE = One or more students that enroll in the number of instructional hours equivalent to a full-time load.

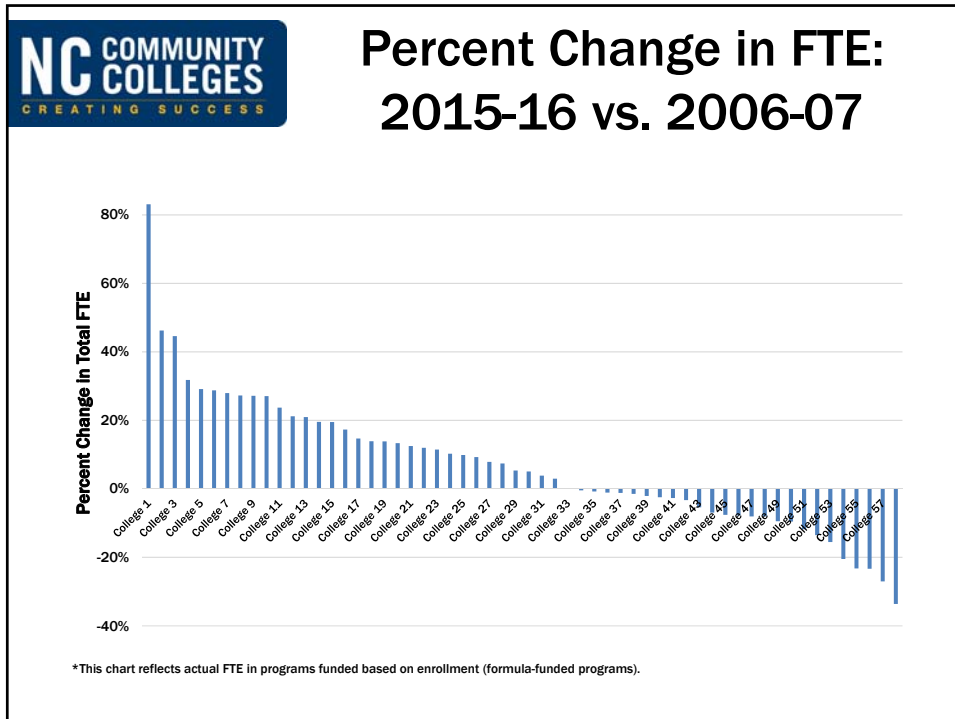












Over the past 10 years...

- College transfer programs have seen the greatest growth in absolute numbers.
- Dual enrollment programs have grown at the fastest rate.
- Non-traditional age students are more likely to enroll in CTE programs and are highly sensitive to economic conditions.
- Enrollment in developmental education has decreased significantly.
- Basic Skills programs have experienced the greatest declines from pre-recession levels (headcount: -41%, FTE: -30%).
- Workforce continuing education enrollment is concentrated in the health and public safety areas.
- Local college enrollment trends vary greatly and are impacted by a variety of complex factors.
