Background: A recommendation from the Future of Community College Nursing Education ad hoc committee Report was to “develop curriculum, coding, tracking, and financial aid processes that differentiate and facilitate potential and actual nursing students in their completion of nursing program courses and RN to BSN articulation agreement pre-requisite coursework for seamless transition to BSN completion.” The Associate in General Education (AGE) Nursing would assist in the coding and tracking of potential and actual nursing students.

Approval of the AGE Nursing program requires that the college be approved to offer the Associate Degree in Nursing. The AGE Nursing program assist students who wish to begin their study toward the Associate in Nursing degree and a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing as based on Blocks 1 through 3 of the *Uniform Articulation Agreement between the University of North Carolina’s Registered Nurse (RN) to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) programs and the North Carolina Community College Associate Degree Nursing Programs* which was approved by the State Board of Community Colleges and the UNC Board of Governors in February 2015. The AGE Nursing shall be granted for a planned program of study consisting of a minimum of 60 semester hours of credit (SHC) of courses.
