**CHAPTER G. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE)**

**SUBCHAPTER 200. FTE REPORTING CATEGORIES/CRITERIA**

**1G SBCCC 200.93 Reporting of Student Hours in Membership for Curriculum Classes**

(a) Academic Term. College boards of trustees shall locally determine the beginning and end date for each academic term within the timeframes of the academic term reporting periods defined in 1G SBCCC 100.1, unless an exception is granted by the System President. The System President may grant an exception if it would not result in an overlap with another academic term, the 10% point of all course sections would fall within the corresponding academic term reporting period, and the exception would not negatively impact the college’s ability to meet data reporting requirements. The academic semester for credit courses shall be designed so that classes may be scheduled to include the number of instructional hours shown in the college catalog and the approved curriculum program of study compliance document and reported for FTE purposes (see 1D SBCCC 400.95(a)). Instructional hours include scheduled class and laboratory sessions as well as examination sessions. Length of semesters or courses may vary as long as credit hours are assigned consistent with 1G SBCCC 100.1 and as long as membership hours are reported consistent with the other provisions of this Rule. If necessary to meet the needs of particular constituents (for example, courses provided at high schools, military bases, prisons, or at the specific request of business), without an exception by the System President, colleges may schedule curriculum course sections that fall outside the academic term beginning and end dates, as defined by the college’s board of trustees. If such course sections cross academic term reporting periods, FTE enrollment shall be reported consistent with the provisions of 1G SBCCC 200.1(a).

(b) Regularly Scheduled Classes.

- 1 (1) A class is regularly scheduled if it meets all of the following criteria:
- 2 (A) Assigned definite beginning and ending time;
- 3 (B) Specific days the class meets is predetermined;
- 4 (C) Specific schedule is included on the Institution Master Schedule or other official
- 5 college documents;
- 6 (D) Class hours are assigned consistent with college catalog and curriculum
- 7 standard requirements; and
- 8 (E) Identified class time and dates are the same for all students registered for the
- 9 class excluding clinical or cooperative work experience.
- 10 (i) Classes which have a regularly scheduled lecture section and a non
- 11 regularly scheduled laboratory section shall satisfy this criteria. The census
- 12 date (10% point) shall be determined from the regularly scheduled portion
- 13 of the class. Verification of student participation in the laboratory section of
- 14 the class shall be available for review.
- 15 (ii) A student shall be considered absent if that student did not attend during
- 16 the specified times or days the class was scheduled to meet.
- 17 (2) A student shall be considered to be in class membership when the student meets
- 18 all of the following criteria:
- 19 (A) enrolled as evidenced by payment of the applicable tuition and fees, or
- 20 obtained a waiver as defined in G.S. 115D-5(b);
- 21 (B) attended one or more classes prior to or on the 10 percent point in the class;
- 22 (C) has not withdrawn or dropped the class prior to or on the 10 percent point.
- 23 (3) Definition of a Student Membership Hour. A student membership hour is one hour
- 24 of scheduled class or laboratory for which the student is enrolled. A college shall
- 25 provide a minimum of 50 minutes of instruction for each scheduled class hour. A
- 26 college shall provide sufficient time between classes to accommodate students
- 27 changing classes. A college shall not report more hours per student than the
- 28 number of class hours scheduled in the approved curriculum program of study
- 29 compliance document.

1 (4) Calculation of Student Membership Hours for Regularly Scheduled Classes.

2 Student membership hours are obtained by multiplying the number of students in  
3 membership at the 10 percent point in the class by the total number of hours the  
4 class is scheduled to meet for the semester as stated in the college catalog and  
5 the approved curriculum program of study compliance document (see 1D SBCCC  
6 400.97(4)).

7 (5) Maintenance of Records of Student Membership Hours. Accurate attendance

8 records shall be maintained for each class through the 10 percent point of the  
9 class. Attendance records shall be signed by the instructor or lead instructor,  
10 verifying their accuracy, and shall be maintained by the college until released from  
11 all compliance reviews (see the Public Records Retention & Disposition Schedule  
12 for Institutions in the Community College System). Student membership hours  
13 shall be summarized in the Institution's Class Report and certified by the president  
14 or designee. For classes identified as non traditional delivery (see Subparagraph  
15 (e)(1) of this Rule), documentation of student contact prior to the 10 percent point  
16 shall be maintained in the same manner as the attendance records mentioned in  
17 this Rule.

18 (c) Non Regularly Scheduled Classes.

19 (1) A non regularly scheduled class may include any or all of the following:

20 (A) a class where a definitive beginning and ending time is not determined;

21 (B) a class offered in a learning laboratory type setting (see 1G SBCCC  
22 200.94(b)(6) for definition of learning laboratory);

23 (C) a class self paced in that the student progresses through the instructional  
24 materials at the student's own pace, and can complete the class as soon as  
25 the student has successfully met the educational objectives. Classes offered  
26 as independent study are generally offered in this manner;

27 (D) a class in which a student may enroll during the initial college registration period  
28 or in which the student may be permitted to enroll at any time during the  
29 semester; or

1 (E) any class not meeting all criteria for a regularly scheduled class, as shown in  
2 Subparagraph (b)(1) of this Rule, is considered to be a non regularly scheduled  
3 class for reporting purposes. Classes defined as non traditional (see Paragraph  
4 (e) of this Rule) or clinical practice (see Paragraph (g) of this Rule) which are  
5 identified as a separate student hour reporting category are not subject to the  
6 above provisions in Paragraph (c).

7 (2) Definition of Student Membership. A student is considered to be in class  
8 membership when the student meets the following criteria:

9 (A) enrolled as evidenced by payment of the applicable tuition and fees, or  
10 obtained a waiver consistent with 1E SBCCC Subchapter 800; and

11 (B) attended one or more classes.

12 (3) Definition of a Student Contact Hour. For non-regularly scheduled classes, student  
13 contact hour is defined as actual time of student attendance in a class or lab. 60  
14 minutes shall constitute an hour. A college shall not report more hours per student  
15 than the number of class hours scheduled in the approved curriculum program of  
16 study compliance document.

17 (4) Calculation of Student Contact Hours for Non Regularly Scheduled Classes. For  
18 these classes, actual time of class attendance for each student determined to be  
19 in membership shall be reported. Student contact hours for these classes are the  
20 sum of all the hours of actual student attendance in a class in a given semester,  
21 and shall not exceed the hours in the approved curriculum program of study  
22 compliance document. (see 1D SBCCC 400.97(4)).

23 (5) Maintenance of Records of Student Contact Hours. Accurate attendance records  
24 shall be maintained for each class of the nature described in this Rule through the  
25 entire semester. Attendance records shall be signed by the instructor or lead  
26 instructor, verifying their accuracy, and shall be maintained by the college until  
27 released from all compliance reviews (see the Public Records Retention &  
28 Disposition Schedule for Institutions in the Community College System). Student  
29 contact hours shall be summarized in the Institution's Class Report and certified  
30 by the president or designee.

1 (d) Skills Laboratory or Computer Tutorial Laboratory. Individualized instructional  
2 laboratories are similar to learning laboratories (see 1G SBCCC 200.94(b)(6)) except  
3 the participants are curriculum students. Skills labs or computer tutorial labs are  
4 remedial or developmental in nature and intended for students who are experiencing  
5 academic difficulty in a particular curriculum course. A skills laboratory instructor shall  
6 be qualified in the single subject area of the skills laboratory. A computer tutorial  
7 laboratory coordinator need not be qualified in any of the subject area(s) provided in  
8 a computer tutorial laboratory. Student contact hours may be reported for budget/FTE  
9 when students are required by their instructor to attend either of the laboratories for  
10 remedial or developmental work and when the skills laboratory instructors or computer  
11 tutorial coordinators are paid with curriculum instructional funds.

12 (1) Documentation of instructor referral shall be maintained for compliance review  
13 purposes. The College shall maintain documentation until released from all  
14 compliance reviews.

15 (2) Homework assignments shall not be reported for budget/FTE. (See 1G SBCCC  
16 200.95(a)).

17 (3) Calculation of Student Contact Hours for Skills Laboratory or Computer Tutorial  
18 Laboratory. For these classes, actual time of class attendance shall be reported;  
19 60 minutes shall constitute an hour. Student hours generated for these types of  
20 classes are the sum of all the hours of actual student attendance in a class in a  
21 given semester.

22 (e) Classes Identified as Curriculum Non Traditional Delivery.

23 (1) Definition. Due to the methodology by which instruction is delivered, non traditional  
24 delivery classes are not consistent with the definitions of regularly scheduled or  
25 non regularly scheduled classes described in this Rule. Non traditional delivery  
26 classes are defined as those classes which are offered through media such as  
27 internet, telecourses, videocassette and other electronic media excluding classes  
28 offered via the North Carolina Information Highway.

29 (2) For those classes identified as non traditional delivery, student attendance in class  
30 or in an orientation session, submission of a written assignment or submission of

1 an examination, is the basis for the determination of class membership at the 10  
2 percent point of the class. Student membership hours earned in non traditional  
3 delivery classes shall be calculated by multiplying the number of students in  
4 membership, as defined in the prior sentence, times the number of hours assigned  
5 to the class in official college documents. For these classes, the number of hours  
6 assigned shall be consistent with the credit hours assigned according to 1G  
7 SBCCC 100.1, as well as the curriculum standard.

8 (3) Non-traditional instruction delivered is pre-structured into identifiable units. Non  
9 traditional delivery classes do not include classes identified as independent study  
10 which are not media based.

11 (f) Curriculum Student Work Experience. The following criteria apply to the reporting  
12 guidelines for students enrolled in curriculum work experience, exclusive of work  
13 station based training. Examples of student work experience include cooperative  
14 education, practicums, and internships.

15 (1) Student membership hours for student work experience shall not generate  
16 budget/FTE without prior approval by the System Office for such activities through  
17 the appropriate curriculum standard.

18 (2) Work Experience. Work experience for curriculum courses shall earn budget/FTE  
19 at the 100 percent rate of assigned work experience hours and shall not exceed a  
20 maximum of 320 membership hours per student per semester.

21 (A) These classes shall be coordinated by college personnel paid with college  
22 instructional funds and may be located in one or more sites.

23 (B) These classes shall be specified in the approved curriculum of the college  
24 consistent with the applicable curriculum standard (see 1D SBCCC  
25 400.97(3)(a)(ii)(D)).

26 (C) The college shall maintain documentation of all student work experience hours.

27 (g) Clinical Practice. Colleges shall report instructional hours of curriculum courses which  
28 include clinical practice, as defined in 1D SBCCC 400.1(c)(2), consistent with the rules  
29 for regularly scheduled classes in Paragraph (b) of this rule if the course meets the  
30 following criteria:

- 1 (1) Assigned definite beginning and ending time;
  - 2 (2) Specific days the class meets are predetermined, although class times, dates, and
  - 3 locations may vary for enrolled students;
  - 4 (3) Clinical hours scheduled are included on the Institution Master Schedule or other
  - 5 official college documents;
  - 6 (4) Class hours are assigned consistent with the college catalog and curriculum
  - 7 standards set forth in 1D SBCCC 400.8;
  - 8 (5) Class hours shall be scheduled to provide a minimum of 50 minutes of instruction;
  - 9 and
  - 10 (6) College instructors who are qualified to teach in the particular program supervise
  - 11 and are paid with college instructional funds for all scheduled class hours
  - 12 (classroom and clinical).
- 13 College personnel shall make documentation verifying student participation in clinical
- 14 practice available for compliance purposes.
