Basic Skills Plus Career Pathway Requests

Request

The State Board is requested to approve new career pathways at 12 community colleges. Colleges provide documentation that the new career pathways align with local workforce demand. Students enrolled in the pathways receive instruction and training that are designed to lead to earning industry recognized credentials and employment. Basic Skills Plus staff work with curriculum, continuing education and student support services to provide support classes and career readiness training.

The Basic Skills Plus program was developed to provide employability skills, job-specific occupational and technical skills, basic skills and developmental education instruction to students concurrently enrolled in a community college course leading to a high school diploma or equivalent certificate. Colleges may waive the tuition and registration fees associated with this instruction.
